FOREWORD

On behalf of the Miles Labor Government, I am pleased to present our independently verified election costings for the 2024 Queensland election.

This is a genuinely fully costed, fully funded plan to deliver cost of living relief and better infrastructure to Queenslanders, with a total announced value of \$9.7 billion when including funding beyond the forward estimates period.

Through the prudent use of available financial allocations, net debt will rise by less than half of that \$9.7 billion, with overall debt levels remaining lower than New South Wales and Victoria. The State budget will return to surplus in 2026-2027 on schedule, ensuring we continue to protect our strong AA+ Credit Rating.

Throughout this campaign, we have been absolutely upfront with Queenslanders about our election costings, providing online real time costing of every single commitment.

Our approach has set a new standard of transparency for Australian political parties, and has exposed David Crisafulli's attempt to hide his secret plan for cuts.

The risk to Queensland from David Crisafulli and the LNP is clear.

Throughout the election period, David Crisafulli has been making promises without saying how he will pay for them.

He has promised lower revenue, lower debt, a balanced budget, a fiscal surplus, as well as more than \$18 billion in commitments.

Even just one of David Crisafulli's promises – a fiscal surplus – would mean 17,000 Queenslanders would be sacked.

Queenslanders will remember that Campbell Newman took the same approach in 2012 and, when the LNP got into Government, they used their unfunded promises to justify sacking 14,000 workers, cutting infrastructure and destroying the Queensland economy.

Only Labor will do what matters for Queenslanders, and only Labor will protect Queensland from David Crisafulli's cuts.

In accordance with the terms and conditions of our engagement letter dated 19th September 2024, Hall Chadwick QLD have reviewed the election policy commitments prepared by the Australian Labor Party, Queensland Branch (Queensland Labor) for the 2024 election.

Queensland Labor's Financial Statement 2024 sets out the investment commitment decisions in relation to estimated costs and funding sources over the forward estimates as prepared by Queensland Labor. The Hall Chadwick QLD review was performed using information made available as at 24th October 2024 as advised by Queensland Labor.

Scope of Work

Queensland Labor is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the election policy commitments, the assumptions used and policy costings.

Our engagement does not constitute either an audit or limited assurance engagement in accordance with AASB standards, we do not express any audit opinion or conclusion on the costings or the net impact of policy commitments.

We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report for any purpose other than for which it was prepared.

Findings

Hall Chadwick QLD have conducted an analysis of the financial commitments as provided by Queensland Labor and the related expenditure and funding sources. We report that:

1. The policy costing models are mathematically accurate.

- The estimated expenditure relating to policy commitments is supported by documented policy material prepared by Queensland Labor.
- The estimated net costs have been calculated in accordance with the supporting material.

Funding from the existing Local Congestion Busting Program is used to fund the Ipswich Central Second River Crossing, Deception Bay Road duplication early corridor works, the business case for level crossing removal Dawson Parade and business cases for upgrading the Palmwood and Cooroy intersections.

Total expenses and capital cover the forward estimates period only and do not include future capital expenditure totalling \$3.743 billion for CopperString 2032, Bribie Island Bridge, Barron River Bridge, the Ipswich Central Second River Crossing and Redland Hospital Expansion Stage 2.

Other existing funding sources utilised are set out under the tables for expense measures and capital measures.

As detailed in Budget Paper 2 there is a provision for operating expenses of \$150 million in 2026-27 and \$2 billion in 2027-28 which is utilised to offset additional expenditure.

Funding of \$2.65 million for the JTYouGotThis program was approved from existing budget allocations for youth crime prevention.

\$13.7 million of existing funding is reallocated to deliver on the Queensland Seafarers Skills & Jobs Fund.

Additional funding is provided to accelerate staffing above the existing Queensland Health Workforce Strategy which is funded on an annual basis from the Queensland Health Funding Model and National Health Reform Agreement.

The Great Barrier Reef Education Experience Program \$4 million is allocated from existing TEQ funding.
\$4 million of additional costs for the Bigger Nature Fund are beyond the forward estimates for stewardship payments.
The remainder of funding is from existing budget allocations approved in the 2024 budget.

Expenses of \$50 million for the Better Boating Camping and Fishing plan are met from unallocated Waste Levy revenue. \$1.2 million for a 1 year program to pilot AEIOU's childcare program for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder is funded out existing allocations under the \$502 million Putting Queensland Kids First strategy.

The Miles Labor Government has already committed to fully fund an additional 500 police officer positions over and above attrition from 1 July 2025 as part of the Community Safety Plan for Queensland building on the commitment for another 2,025 police personnel by 2025 with a commitment for at least 1600 recruits to go through the academy in the next term of Parliament.

Funding of \$112.5 million for the Institute of Urban Indigenous Health First Nations health and wellbeing hubs was approved in the 2024 Budget as part of the 10.6% uplift in funding to Queensland Health.

The \$119.7 million Townsville University Hospital Car Park is funded from the existing Queensland Health capital program for hospital car parks.

The following projects are funded from existing Department of Transport and Main Roads planning allocations - The Logan Road Miles Plating Intersection study for Rochedale, Centenary Motorway tunnel feasibility study, business case for upgrade of the Cunningham Highway Amberley Interchange.

Land acquisition for a new Burpengary East Primary School is funded from the existing strategic land acquisition fund to acquire land for new and expanded schools.

The commitment to secure a site for a future Greenbank (Greater Flagstone) area high school is to be funded from the existing strategic land acquisition fund.

Existing funding is utilised for the release of land for parkland at Nursery Road Special School.

Existing funding of \$100,000 in the Department of Transport and Main Roads is being utilised for Bethania Rail Trail Security Fencing.

The \$45 million commitment from the Cairns Airport Eastern Aviation Precinct common user hangar is funded out of the Invested in Queensland Fund.

The Transport and Main Roads Maritime Safety Queensland's Operational Budget will allocate \$200,000 for two facilities on Brisbane's north and south sides for ceremonial spaces for Hindu communities.

\$15 million of funding has been previously committed for the Weinam Creek ferry terminal carpark.

The Sunshine, Bray Park and Eagle Junction Station Accessibility Upgrades are funded out of the existing Station Accessibility Upgrade Program.

Funding for a Nurse Led Clinic fitout at Kirwan Health Campus will be delivered under the existing capital program.

Funding for SES depot upgrades of \$2 million for the Bundaberg SES facility and \$3.5 million for the Deception Bay SES facility is provided from existing unallocated resources.

Capital expenditure of \$54.5 million for the Better Boating Camping and Fishing plan including funding for boat ramps is met from unallocated Waste Levy revenue and the existing Sunwater facilities upgrade program.

Funding of \$3 million has been brought forward within the existing QTRIP program for the detailed business case for upgrades to the Sunshine Motorway from Pacific Paradise to Coolum.
